A Little Book About ABCs

1. Background Knowledge

- 이 책에는 알파벳 26 글자와 그 글자로 시작하는 단어들이 제시되고 있습니다. 아이가 알파벳 글자를 모두 알고 있는지 ABC 노래를 함께 불러 보고, 각 글자로 시작하는 단어는 어떤 게 있는지 이야기하며 책을 읽어 봅니다.

2. Picture Walking

[cover page]

Mom: Look at the cover. What letters do you see?

Child: A, B, C.

Mom: Great! This is a little book about ABCs. What animals do you see?

Child: Mice.

Mom: Right. The mice are playing on the letters. Let's read the book and find out more about

letters.

[page 1]

Mom: The book starts with an A. What animals do you see?

Child: A mouse and an alligator.

Mom: Great! "Alligator" starts with an A. Is the mouse happy to see the alligator?

Child: Yes.

Mom: Right. He says it's always a treat to see an alligator. Let's turn to the next page.

[page 2-3]

Mom: Now what is B for?

Child: B is for beautiful butterflies.

Mom: Right. Which butterfly do you think is the most beautiful?

Child: This one.

Mom: Great! It has beautiful colors. What is C for?

Child: C is for chunks of cheese.

Mom: Great! Mice love to eat cheese. "Chunks" starts with a C, and "cheese" starts with a C, too.

[page 4-5]

Mom: The mouse is peeking through the letter D. What are these animals?

Child: They are dragonflies.

Mom: Right. D is for dainty dragonflies. What is E for?

Child: E is for eight eggs.

Mom: Yes. The number eight starts with an E, and the word "eggs" starts with an E, too. What

came out of the eggs?

Child: Alligators.

Mom: Right. They were alligator eggs.

[page 6-7]

Mom: Now we have an F. What animal do you see?

Child: I see a frog.

Mom: Great! It says F is for friendly frog. Does this frog look friendly?

Child: Yes.

Mom: What is G for?

Child: It is for green grass.

Mom: Right. Do you see green grass?

Child: Yes.

Mom: What about H?

Child: H is for hat.

Mom: What color is the hat?

Child: It is green.

[page 8-9]

Mom: It says I is for interesting inchworm. Do you see an inchworm in the picture?

Child: Yes. It is here.

Mom: Great! Do you know why this worm is called an inchworm?

Child: No.

Mom: The worm bends its body and stretches back again to move. It moves inch by inch like it is measuring something.

Child: Oh.

Mom: What is J for?

Child: J is for joyful jellyfish.

Mom: Great! These two words, "joyful" and "jellyfish," start with a J.

Mom: What is the mouse doing?

Child: He is flying a kite.

Mom: Yes. "Kite" starts with a K. What words starts with an L?

Child: Leaves.

Mom: Great! "Lots", "lovely", and "leaves" all start with an L. The mouse is sweeping the leaves

away.

Mom: What letter do you see now?

Child: M.

Mom: Great! M is for many mice! How many mice do you see? Shall we count?

Child: One, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten!

Mom: There are ten mice! What is N for?

Child: N is for nice.

Mom: "Mice" and "nice" rhyme. It is nice to see your friends.

Mom: Look! The mouse is rowing a boat on the ocean. What letter does "ocean" start with?

Child: It starts with an O.

Mom: Right. "Out" and "on" also start with an O. What is P for?

Child: P is for pile of pebbles.

Mom: Great! The mouse has a pile of pebbles. Do you like to play with pebbles?

Child: Yes.

Mom: Q is for quiet. What is the mouse saying?

Child: Shhh!

Mom: Right. The word "quiet" starts with a Q. What animals do you see on the next page?

Child: I see rabbits.

Mom: Yes. The rabbits are resting on the grass. Maybe they just ate some carrots. They are

sleeping.

Mom: Look at all these shells! Where do you usually see shells?

Child: I see them by the sea.

Mom: Right. They are in the sand by the sea. Shells and sand both start with an S. Which shell do

you like best?

Child: I like this one.

Mom: Great! What animal starts with a T?

Child: A turtle!

Mom: Right. T is for tiny turtle. What does the mouse have?

Child: He has an umbrella.

Mom: Right! The mouse is holding an umbrella for the turtle.

Mom: Now we have a V! What starts with a V?

Child: Vegetables.

Mom: Can you name some of these vegetables? Why don't we say their names together? Peas,

turnips, carrots, beets, asparagus ...

[page 22-23]

Mom: We have come all the way to W now. What do you see that starts with a W?

Child: Wall.

Mom: W is for wide wall! The mouse is trying to look on the other side of the wall. What's on the

other side of the wall?

Child: Two mice with fags and an X.

Mom: Right. We have a very colorful X here. It says X is for x-tra special surprise. I wonder who

the surprise is for.

Mom: Wow! It is a dark night. What is Y for?

Child: Y is for yawn.

Mom: That's right! The small mouse is sleepy. What do you see in the sky?

Child: I see the moon and the stars.

Mom: Great! We have the last letter, Z. What is Z for?

Child: Z is for zzzz.

Mom: How cute! This mouse is already sleeping. Let's say zzzz together.

Child and MOM: Zzzz.

3. Comprehension Check-up

알파벳 글자들을 하나하나 읽어보고 그 글자로 시작하는 단어를 하나씩 말해 봅니다.

Mom: Let's read all the English letters together. Ready?

Child and Mom: A, B, C, D, E, F, G...

Mom: Good job! Now let's say a word that begins with each letter. What word starts with an A?

Child: Alligator.

Mom: Great! What about B?

Child: Butterflies.

Mom: Excellent!

Child: Yes.

4. Activity

1) Read Aloud

- 책을 천천히 함께 읽어 봅니다. 혼자서도 읽어 봅니다.

2) Phonemic Awareness

- 단어의 첫 소리를 따로 떼어 들려주다가 단어를 말해 줍니다. 아이에게 첫 글자를 맞추어 보도록 합니다.

Mom: I'm going to say a word. Can you guess what letter it starts with? "T, T, Turtle." Child: T.

Mom: Great! Turtle starts with a T. Now listen to another word. "F, F, Frog."

Child: F!

Mom: Good job! Let's try another word. "L, L, Leaves."

Child: L!

3) Phonics

- 책에서 -ice 소리로 끝나는 단어들을 찾아 봅니다. (mice, nice) 같은 rhyme을 가진 다른 단어들도 있다는 것을 알려 줍니다. (ice, rice) 글자 카드를 만들어 소리를 듣고 조합해 보도록 합니다.

Child: Eggs!

Mom: Great job!
