

My Mum and Dad Make Me Laugh

1. Background Knowledge

- 아이의 아빠는 줄무늬를 좋아하고 엄마는 점무늬를 좋아합니다. 주변 다양한 사물의 색깔, 모양, 패턴을 이야기해 봅시다.

Mom: Look around this room. What shapes and patterns do you see?

Child: I see a round clock.

Mom: I see a square table.

Child: I see a rectangular door.

Mom: I see a striped curtain.

Child: I see spotted wallpaper.

2. Picture Walking

[Cover Page]

Mom: Look at this book. There is a family.

Child: There is Mum, Dad, and a little boy.

Mom: Look at Mom. What is she wearing?

Child: She has a spotted hair band, spotted ear rings, a spotted shirt... Everything is spotted!

Mom: Wow! Mum loves spots. What about Dad?

Child: Dad has a striped shirt, striped pants, and striped shoes.

Mom: Yes. What does he like?

Child: Dad likes striped stuff.

Mom: I see. Then what about the little boy? What does he wear?

Child: He just wears plain grey stuff.

Mom: Great. Maybe he doesn't like any patterns. The title is "My Mum and Dad Make Me Laugh", written by Nick Sharratt.

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Mom: Look. There are three people. Who are they?

Child: They are Mum, Dad, and a little boy.

Mom: Look at Mum. Can you guess what her favorite pattern is?

Child: Yes, she likes spots.

Mom: That's right. She is wearing a spotted hair band, spotted ear rings, a spotted shirt, spotted pants, and spotted shoes.

Mom: What about dad?

Child: He likes stripes.

Mom: Can you tell me what he is wearing?

Child: Of course. He has a striped shirt, striped pants, and striped shoes.

Mom: Great. And they have a lovely boy. Mum and Dad love spots and stripes so much that their house is covered with spots and stripes. Their wall is spotted and striped. And their carpet has a spotted pattern.

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Mom: Let's go to the bathroom. Can you tell me what things have spots and stripes?

Child: The bathroom tiles and the curtain are covered with spots and stripes.

Mom: That's right. There is a robe hanging on the door. Whose striped robe is it?

Child: It belongs to Dad.

Mom: Then all the spotted things belong to Mum. What are they?

Child: The spotted slippers, the spotted robe, the spotted towel, and the spotted toothbrush belong to Mum.

Mom: Great. Then whose grey tooth brush is this?

Child: It belongs to the boy. He was wearing a grey shirt and shorts before.

Mom: All the grey stuff belongs to the boy. What are some grey things in the bathroom?

Child: There is a pair of grey socks, and there are grey tiles on the ground.

Mom: What season is it?

Child: It's winter. It's snowing.

Mom: Mum is lying on her spotted sofa wearing a spotted sweater and skirt, and she reads "Beauty Spot" and "Train Spotter's Weekly".

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Mom: What season is it?

Child: It's summer.

Mom: What does she do in summer?

Child: She is lying in the sun wearing a spotted bikini. She reads "Picnic Spot Guide" and

"Butterfly Spotting".

Mom: She loves to play Dot to Dot Puzzles too. What about her boy?

Child: He is wearing a grey swimming suit.

Mom: What about his favorite color? What is it?

Child: He loves grey.

Mom: Great.

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Mom: Look at Dad. What is he wearing?

Child: He is wearing a striped tie and suit.

Mom: Can you tell me what other things have stripes in this picture?

Child: Stripes on the crosswalk, stripes on an umbrella...

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Mom: Can you tell me what things have stripes in this picture?

Child: Chairs, a mat, pots, and cups are covered with stripes.

Mom: What is Dad doing?

Child: He is eating humbugs.

Mom: They are striped.

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Mom: What are they doing?

Child: Mum is putting on a spotted earring. Dad is putting on a striped tie. And the little boy is putting on a grey shirt.

Mom: They are at a restaurant. What is each person eating?

Child: Mum is eating a pizza. Dad is eating an ice cream. The little boy is eating a plain bun.

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Mom: Dad drove and went through the safari. What did they see first?

Child: They saw spotted cheetahs.

Mom: Who was amazed to see these spotted animals?

Child: Mum, of course.

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Mom: Then what did they see?

Child: They saw striped zebras.

Mom: Who was delighted to see the striped zebras?

Child: The dad of course.

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Mom: What were the last animals they saw?

Child: They saw grey elephants.

Mom: And what were the elephants eating?

Child: A basket of buns, Mom.

Mom: These buns were like the buns the boy had had at the restaurant. Do you remember?

Child: That's right, Mom.

Mom: The little boy likes the elephants' buns, doesn't he?

Child: I guess so, Mom.

Mom: Then what does the little boy like most? Let's read the book and find out.

3. Comprehension Check Up

Mom: What does Mum like to do in winter?

Child: She likes to read a magazine called "Beauty Spot" on her spotted sofa.

Mom: What does Mum like to do in summer?

Child: She likes to lay in the sun in her spotted bikini and play Dot to Dot Puzzles.

Mom: What does Dad like to do on weekdays?

Child: Dad likes to walk on the striped crosswalk while wearing a striped suit and scarf with a striped umbrella.

Mom: What does he like to do on weekends?

Child: He likes to sit on a striped chair and eat striped candies and watch football games.

Mom: What do they think about the little boy's grey top and trousers?

Child: They think they are boring because there have no patterns.

Mom: What did they have at the restaurant?

Child: Mom had a spotty pizza. Dad ordered a striped ice cream. The little boy had a bun.

Mom: What did they think about his choice?

Child: They thought it was funny.

Mom: What was the mom's favorite animal at the safari?

Child: She loved the jaguars with brown spots.

Mom: What was Dad's favorite animal at the safari?

Child: Dad loved the striped zebras.

Mom: What was the little boy's favorite animal?

Child: He loved the grey elephants.

4. Activities

1) 꾸미고 싶은 방 이야기하기

- 자신의 방에 꾸미고 싶은 색깔, 모양, 패턴, 또는 가지고 싶은 것들에 대해 이야기해 봅시다.

Mom: Do you like the little boy's room?

Child: Yes, I do.

Mom: Can you tell if the boy really likes anything?

Child: He likes grey elephants.

Mom: How do you know?

Child: Because there are many elephant posters, pictures, and toys in his room.

Mom: Do you want to decorate our room with your favorite things?

Child: Yes, I do!

2) Favorite Things

- 좋아하는 색깔, 모양, 그리고 패턴에 대해 이야기해 봅시다.

Mom: What is your favorite color?

Child: I love blue.

Mom: Can you name something blue that you have?

Child: I have a blue backpack. I have a blue pillow. I have blue gloves.

Mom: Wow, you really do love blue! I like orange. Can you name some orange things that I have?

Child: You have an orange pen. You have an orange purse.

Mom: That's right.

3) Which Belongs to Whom?

- 각각의 사물이 누구에게 속한 것인지 이야기해 봅시다.

Mom: There are three pairs of socks on the clothesline.

There are spotted ones, grey ones, and striped ones.

Whose spotted socks are these?

Child: They belong to Mom.

Mom: That's right, Mom loves spots. What about the grey ones?

Child: They belong to the little boy.

Mom: Great. The little boy likes grey. Whose striped socks are these?

Child: They belong to Dad.

Mom: That's right. Dad loves stripes.
