Crocodiles Need Kisses Too

1. Background Knowledge

악어가 어떤 동물인지 이야기해보세요.

Mom: Do you like crocodiles?

Child: No, they are scary!

Mom: Why?

Child: They look scary. They have lots of teeth in a big mouth! They can eat me!

Mom: Yes, they do look scary.

이 책에서는 겉모습은 무서운 동물들이지만 너와 엄마처럼 서로를 아끼는 동물들을 보게 될 거야. But, in this book, we will see that crocodiles and other animals that seem scary are maybe not so different from you and me.

2. Picture Walking

[Cover Page]

Mom: Look at the cover. What do you see?

Child: I see two crocodiles kissing.

Mom: Yes.

두 악어의 다른 점이 무엇일까? Do you see any differences between the two crocodiles?

Child: One is bigger and darker green than the other.

Mom: Right. What do you think these two crocodiles are to each other?

Child: Maybe Mommy and child?

Mom: Yes, I think you're right. Do you think they are happy?

Child: Yes, they are smiling.

Mom: That's right. What do you think this book is about?

Child: Maybe a crocodile family?

Mom: That's a good guess! Let's find out.

[타이틀 페이지]

Mom: What do you see here on the right page?

Child: I see a long, big tail, with spikes on it. It's green and bumpy.

Mom: Right. 누구의 꼬리일까? What kind of tail do you think this is?

Child: A crocodile tail!

Mom: Yes, I think you're right. What do you see on the left?

Child: I see some building blocks in a tower, and a poster or drawing on the wall, of different animals.

Mom: Great! What animals can you see?

Child: A crocodile, a tiger, a bird, a spider, a gorilla, a butterfly, a shark and a snake.

Mom: Wonderful! Wow, you know lots of animals! Maybe we will see the animals in the book.

What is the first animal on the poster again?

Child: Crocodile!

Mom: Right! And what's on the cover?

Child: Crocodiles!

Mom: So maybe after the crocodiles...

Child: The other animals will come.

Mom: That's a good answer! Let's see.

[page 2-3]

Mom: What do you see here?

Child: A crocodile!

Mom: 악어의 어디가 보이니? What part of the crocodile do you see?

Child: Its eye and its mouth with big teeth.

Mom: 뭘 하고 있는 걸까? What is it doing with its mouth?

Child: Maybe eating something? Its mouth is open.

Mom: Right, its mouth is open. Do you think it's scary?

Child: Yes!

Mom: It does look a bit scary. Where is the crocodile?

Child: I think it's hiding in the leaves.

Mom: What do you think will happen on the next page?

Child: I think it will catch something and eat it!

Mom: That's a good guess. Let's find out!

[page 4-5]

Mom: What do you see here?

Child: Two crocodiles kissing!

Mom: Yes!

Child: It happened on the cover too.

Mom: Right. So what are these crocodiles to each other?

Child: I think it's a mommy and her baby.

Mom: Yes. What do you think of the baby?

Child: It's so cute! It's so little.

Mom: Yes, does it look scary?

Child: No.

Mom: 악어들과 우리의 공통점이 있을까? Do you have anything in common with these crocodiles?

Child: The mommy loves her baby, just like you love me!

Mom: Right! Very good! I do love you.

It looks like the mommy crocodile takes care of her baby crocodile.

Child: Yes, and the baby loves its mommy, like I love you.

Mom: That's so sweet, thanks! Let's look at the next page.

[page 6-7]

Mom: Look at the picture. We see a kind of animal with long hair, hiding behind a tree. It's in a forest I think, in the snow.

Do you know what this animal is?

Child: No.

Mom: It's a porcupine. (가시를 짚으며)이건 털이 아니라 quills 라고 길고 뾰족한 가시야. That's not hair. Those are prickly, long spiky things called quills. They're sharp.

Do you think this is a scary animal?

Child: A little. It looks cute.

Mom: Yes, it does. Do you think it's dangerous?

Child: It could be. But as long as you leave it alone and don't touch it, it's ok.

Mom: I think you're right. Let's see what comes next.

Child: Ok.

[page 8-9]

Mom: What's happening here?

Child: The porcupine is hugging its baby.

Mom: Right! Aren't they cute?

Child: Yes! So cute!

Mom: quills 때문에 안아주는 게 힘들까? Because of their quills, do you think it's hard for them to hug?

Child: Maybe they have to be careful. I don't think they will hurt each other.

Mom: I don't think so either.

What do you see on the right page?

Child: A snake!

Mom: It has a sharp tooth and something on its tail.

꼬리에 달린 건 rattle 인데 소리가 나. 어떤 의미일까? That's called a rattle. It makes noise.

What do you think it means?

Child: Watch out! I'm coming!

Mom: 맞아, 이 뱀은 독이 있어서 물리면 몹시 아프단다. That's right! It's poisonous, so if you get

bitten by a rattlesnake it hurts a lot!

그래서 rattle 소리가 들리면... So if you hear a rattle...

Child: Run away!

[page 10-11]

Mom: What's happening here?

Child: The snake is touching heads with its kid.

Mom: Yes. It takes care of its kid. Do they look cute?

Child: Yes! But, I'm still scared of them.

Mom: Yeah, me too. Let's look at the next page.

Child: Ok.

[page 12-13]

Mom: What do you see here?

Child: A tree, with some birds in a nest.

Mom: Yes. They have red heads and pink beaks, and sharp feet.

Do you think these are babies?

Child: Maybe. They do look a little small.

Mom: 이렇게 생긴 새를 본적 있니? Have you seen any birds like this before?

Child: No.

Mom: Well, let's see what's on the next page.

[page 14-15]

Mom: What is happening on the left page?

Child: The mommy bird is hugging her babies.

Mom: Right. Do you think she's a good mommy?

Child: Yes, she's taking care of her babies.

Mom: 이 새는 독수리야. 무서운 동물이지만, 새끼들을 사랑한단다. This bird is a vulture.

It can be a scary bird, but it still loves its babies.

What can you see on the other page?

Child: A shark!

Mom: How do you know?

Child: I can see its fin sticking out of the water.

Mom: Right. How do you feel about sharks?

Child: They're scary!!

Mom: Why?

Child: They can eat me!

Mom: Yes, they can be dangerous.

[page 16-17]

Mom: What do you see here?

Child: The mommy shark is swimming with her baby shark.

Mom: Yes, I think they're kissing.

The baby shark is small and cute.

Would you like to swim with the baby shark?

Child: Maybe. But if the mommy shark is nearby, it will be scary.

Mom: Yes, I think you're right.

[page 18-19]

Mom: What's happening here?

Child: A monkey is in the trees.

Mom: 원숭이가 뭘 하고 있는 것 같니? What do you think it's doing?

Child: It looks like it's yelling.

Mom: Yes, I think you're right. Can you see anything else?

Child: Some birds are flying away.

Mom: Yes, maybe they are flying away because the monkey is loud.

Child: Yes, that's why!

[page 20-21]

Mom: What can you see here?

Child: The monkey is resting on his mommy. He's riding his mommy's back.

Mom: Right, like your daddy sometimes carries you on his back.

이건 원숭이가 아니고, 고릴라란다. This is not actually a monkey. It's a gorilla.

So the baby is...

Child: A baby gorilla!

Mom: 맞아, 원숭이랑 고릴라는 달라. 하지만 비슷해 보여. Right, monkeys and gorillas are different,

but some of their parts look the same.

What can you see on the other page?

Child: Baby tigers!

Mom: Yes, do you like them?

Child: Yes, they're so cute! I want one.

Mom: It might be fun to have one as a pet. But what happens when they grow up?

Child: They become big tigers!

Mom: Do you think you could take care of a big tiger?

Child: No! Too dangerous!

Mom: Right! So do you still want a baby tiger?

Child: No.

Mom: It's probably better if it lives...

Child: With his family in the jungle.

Mom: Yes!

[page 22-23]

Mom: What do you see here?

Child: The baby tigers are hugging their mommy.

Mom: Yes, how big is the mommy?

Child: Much bigger than the babies.

Mom: The mommy takes care of its babies too.

Child: Yes.

[page 24-25]

Mom: What's this?

Child: A big spider!

Mom: How do you know?

Child: It has 8 hairy legs! And I remember it from the poster on the first page.

Mom: Wow, what a good memory! Do you like spiders?

Child: No!

Mom: Why not?

Child: They're creepy and crawly! Yuck!

Mom: 잡아볼 수 있겠니? Could you hold one?

Child: No way! They can be poisonous!

Mom: Right, some can bite and hurt you, but not all of them. But you have to be careful.

Child: Yes. I don't know which spider is ok, so I don't want to be near any of them!

Mom: You have a good point.

Mom: What do you see here?

Child: Baby spiders with their mommy.

Mom: 새끼가 몇 마리니? How many babies are there?

Child: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5!

Mom: Right. Do they look cute?

Child: A little.

Mom: What do you see on the right page?

Child: A crocodile tail knocking over some blocks.

Mom: Yes. Do you think this is strange?

Child: Yes, how come a crocodile is around some blocks?

Mom: Right, is the crocodile in someone's house?

Child: Maybe some kids left their blocks around a crocodile's home?

Mom: That's a good guess. Let's see.

[page 28-29]

Mom: So what is it?

Child: 악어 모양 옷을 입고 있는 아이네요. It's a kid in a crocodile costume!

Mom: What is the kid doing?

Child: It's yelling and screaming, and beating the ground, kicking all his blocks.

Mom: Why is he doing that?

Child: He's angry.

Mom: What do you think made him angry?

Child: Maybe he didn't get something he wanted.

Mom: Maybe. Do you ever feel this way?

Child: Yes.

Mom: What do you think will happen on the next page?

Child: Maybe the kid will get in trouble?

Mom: Let's find out.

[page 30-31]

Mom: What happened?

Child: The mommy is hugging her kid. And the kid is crying.

Mom: What do you think of this?

Child: The mommy is really nice.

Mom: Do you think the kid is angry?

Child: No, not anymore. He's sorry and sad.

Mom: 아마 화가 난 게 아닐지도 몰라. 뭔가가 아이를 기분 나쁘거나 슬프게 만들어서 짜증이 난 걸수 도 있단다. 너도 그런 기분일 때가 있니? Maybe he wasn't really angry. Maybe something made him feel sad and bad, and that's why he had a tantrum. Do you feel like that sometimes?

Child: Yes.

Mom: Do you want me to hug you when you feel like that?

Child: Yes.

Mom: I want to do that too. You can tell me when you need a hug. And I'll tell you too, ok?

Child: Ok.

Mom: 엄마가 너를 안아 줄 때는 "널 사랑해" 라는 뜻이란다. When I hug you, it means, "I love you."

Child: I love you too!

Mom: Thanks for telling me that, I love hearing it!

Mom: What do you see on the last page?

Child: The mommy and the kid looking at each other.

Mom: 아직도 아이 기분이 안 좋아 보이니? Is the kid still feeling bad?

Child: No, he looks happy. They both look happy.

Mom: Yes. Does this remind you of the animals we saw in the book?

Child: Yes, all the mommy animals taking care of the baby animals, showing them they love them.

Mom: Yes, we all have that in common. Isn't that amazing?

Child: Amazing!

4. Activity
