Five Minutes

1. Background Knowledge

상황에 따라 너무 느리고, 너무 빠른 시간에 대해서 생각해 보아요.

Mom: 가장 좋아하는 TV 프로그램을 5 분 더 기다려야 할 때 기분이 어떠니? How do you feel when you have to wait 5 more minutes to watch your favorite show? Child: I feel like I can't wait! Mom: It feels like time is really slow, right? Like the time will never come? Child: Yes! Mom: And then how does time feel when you finally get to watch the show? Child: I wish the show would never end! I want it to go on forever! Mom: Right. And when I tell you it's time to stop watching YouTube? What do you always ask me for? Child: One more video! Mom: 5 or 10 more minutes, right? Child: Yes!

Mom: 이 책은 상황에 따라 달라지는 시간의 느낌에 대해서 이야기하고 있단다. This book is about this idea of time and how it can feel different in different situations.

2. Picture Walking

[Cover Page]

Mom: Look at the cover. What is he doing?

Child: At the top of the page, he looks like he's running. At the bottom right, he's jumping and yelling. And on the bottom left he's just standing and looking up. Maybe he's waiting for something.

Mom: Very good. (시계를 가리키며) What does this look like?

Child: Uh... Oh, a clock!

Mom: Very good! 동그란 시계는 몇 시간을 보여주니? How many hours does a round clock with hands show?

Child: 12!

Mom: Right.

[page1]

Mom: The boy is in red pajamas. He's holding a stuffed bunny.

이 소년은 잠에서 깬 걸까? 아니면 잠을 자려고 하는 걸까? Do you think he just woke up? Or is he going to sleep?

Child: I think he just woke up.

Mom: Where do you think he's going?

Child: If he just woke up, maybe to the bathroom.

Mom: Good guess. Let's see.

[page 3]

Mom: The boy is at the door of his parents bedroom, looking in.

부모님을 뭐하고 있니? What are his parents doing?

Child: They're still in bed, sleeping.

Mom: What do you think the boy is doing?

Child: I think he woke up and he can't sleep anymore, so he wants his parents to wake up too.

Mom: Do you ever do this?

Child: Sometimes.

[page 4-5]

Mom: Now the parents are awake, and the dad is walking to the left and the mom is walking to

the right. How do they seem?

Child: Really busy.

Mom: Do you know what time it is?

Child: Yes, there's a clock. It's eight.

Mom: And what about the boy?

Child: He looks busy too. He's kind of running with a bowl. I think he's eating or just finished eating his breakfast.

Mom: Very good. What about the right page?

Child: The boy looks kind of annoyed. He's with his dad.

Mom: Why do you think the boy is annoyed?

Child: He looks like he's waiting for his dad.

Mom: What is the dad doing?

Are there any other clues that might tell you where they are?

There's a counter and a lady behind it, hanging some clothes, and other clothes are hanging.

Child: A dry cleaning place.

Mom: So what do you think the dad is doing there?

Child: He's bringing a shirt to get cleaned!

Mom: Yes, or he's picking one up that was cleaned already.

Child: Okay.

[page 6-7]

Mom: (왼쪽 페이지를 짚으며) What do you see here?

Child: The boy is with his mom now. He's waiting while his mom is talking to someone.

Mom: Where do you think they are?

Child: It looks like a bank.

Mom: Why do you think that?

Child: She's standing over a counter and there are people sitting on the other side, behind a clear wall or window.

Mom: Very good. (오른쪽 페이지를 짚으며) And on this page?

Child: Now the mom is waiting in line somewhere else. And the boy is hanging on to his mom and yelling or crying.

Mom: Why do you think he's acting like this?

Child: Because he's tired and annoyed. He doesn't want to be waiting in line. He wants to go home.

Mom: Do you ever feel like this?

Child: Yes, all the time!

Mom: When?

- Child: When I have to go with you anywhere, like the supermarket or the bank.
- Mom: Where do you think this is?
- **Child:** I think it's the post office. There's a sign on the wall that says "POS", the beginning of the word "post office". And the people waiting are holding packages.

Mom: Very good! What time is it?

Child: It looks like 10 am.

[page 8-9]

Mom: The boy is with the dad. There are other kids too. It looks like they're at a pet store. There are all kinds of animals behind some glass.

What animals can you see?

Child: I see rabbits and birds and dogs.

Mom: 소년의 기분이 어떤 것 같니? How do you think the boy feels here?

Child: He looks like he wants a dog.

Mom: Does he look annoyed or like he's waiting here?

Child: No.

[page 10-11]

Mom: It looks like the boy is waiting at a door for it to open.

여기가 어디일까? Where do you think this is?

Child: It looks like the library?

Mom: Why do you think that?

Child: There are other people waiting with the boy too, holding lots of books, and on the other page, the boy is carrying books too and is waiting in line in front of a desk.

Mom: What do you think he's waiting for?

Child: To get his books checked out so he can take them home.

Mom: Very good. How do you think he feels about waiting?

Child: Like it's taking too long. And he wishes it would go faster.

Mom: 책 빌리는 걸 좋아하니? Do you like borrowing books?

Child: Yes. I can find all different kinds of books and read as many as I want.

[page 12-13]
Mom: What's happening here?
Child: The boy is at the dentist.
Mom: What is he doing?
Child: He's waiting his turn.
Mom: How do you think he feels about waiting?

Child: I think he wants to wait longer.

Mom: Why?

Child: I don't think he wants his turn to come fast?

Mom: Why not?

Child: Because I feel that way too! I'm scared of the dentist. It hurts.

Mom: Yes, I see. So I guess he wishes time would slow down.

(오른쪽 페이지를 짚으며) And on the other page?

Child: Now he's in the dentist's chair with the dentist. He looks scared.

Mom: How do you think he feels about time now?

Child: I think he wants time to go really fast!

Mom: I think you're right.

[page 14-15]

Mom: Now the mom is driving in a red car with the boy.

Are they driving fast?

Child: No, there are a lot of cars. I think they're stuck in traffic.

Mom: What do you think the boy is saying?

Child: "Are we there yet?"

Mom: Yes!

Where do you think they're going?

Child: Home?

Mom: What about somewhere fun?

Child: Uh... the beach?

Mom: Let's find out.

[page 16-17] Mom: Where did they go? Child: It looks like an amusement park. Mom: How do you know? Child: I can see the rollercoaster in the back, and a big hot air balloon with red and white stripes. Mom: How does the boy look? Child: He's so excited and happy! He's running with other kids to get to the park. Mom: 부모님은 어디에 있을까? Where are his parents? Child: They're still in the car. The boy's car door, where the boy came out, is still open. Mom: So the boy didn't even close his door? Child: No, he was in too much of a hurry. He couldn't wait.

[page 18-19]

Mom: What is happening on the left page?

Child: The boy has to go to the bathroom, and he can't wait! He really has to go!

Mom: Right he's having a hard time. 기다림은 길게만 느껴질 거야. Waiting must feel like a long time.

Child: Yes, forever!

Mom: And on the right page?

Child: The boy is waiting in line for a ride with his dad.

Mom: How does the boy feel?

Child: He's tired and the line is taking too long. He really wants the line to go faster!

Mom: How long do you think this line will take?

Child: It looks really long, maybe a half hour, or an hour.

Mom: 맞아, 놀이공원에 줄을 서면 한 시간은 기다려야 하지. 너는 줄을 서서 기다리는 게 쉽니? Yes,

lines at amusement parks usually take an hour. Is it easy for you to wait in line at the amusement park?

Child: Sometimes it's ok, but sometimes it's really long and annoying. If I can play a video game or play with friends while waiting in line, it's ok. It goes faster.

[page 20-21]

Mom: The boy is finally riding the rollercoaster.

Is he happy?

Child: Yes, he really had fun on the rollercoaster.

Mom: 롤러코스터 좋아하니? Do you like rollercoasters?

Child: Yes!

Mom: What about the right page?

Child: The boy looks sad and disappointed that the ride is over.

Mom: How do you think the boy feels about how long the ride is?

Child: It's too fast! Too short!

Mom: Do you wish rollercoasters were longer?

Child: Yes!

[page 22-23]

Mom: The boy is playing an amusement park game. He's trying to catch a toy duck with a fishing pole. Is he getting it?

Child: No, he looks like he's having trouble.

Mom: Does it look hard?

Child: Yes, it's taking him a long time.

[page 24-25]

Mom: The boy and his parents are in their red car again.

소년은 차에서 뭘 하는 것 같니? Is the boy doing anything in the car?

Child: It looks like he went to sleep.

Mom: When you sleep in the car, does it feel like a long time has passed?

Child: No, it feels really short.

Mom: Where do you think they're going?

Child: I think they're going home.

[page 26-27]

Mom: The family is back at home, and the dad is cooking and the boy is hungry, waiting

for his dinner. And after dinner, they wash the dishes.

Mom: 소년이 접시 닦는 걸 좋아하는 것 같니? Do you think the boy likes washing the dishes?

Child: No, it looks like it's his chore.

Mom: Do you like washing dishes?

Child: No, it's boring and tiring!

Mom: But necessary! And you do such a good job!

[page 28-29]

Mom: Now the boy is taking a bath and going to bed.

Does he look happy about the bath?

Child: No, he looks mad.

Mom: Do you like baths?

Child: Sometimes.

Mom: The boy is reading to his stuffed animals. But they're all looking toward the door, where one parent is saying hi.

Or maybe the parent is saying only five more minutes with his or her hand.

[page 30-31]

Mom: What happened?

Child: The boy was still reading to his stuffed animals. Then the dad came and read to the boy.

Mom: How do you think the boy feels about that?

Child: He likes it. It looks like he's having a good time.

Mom: 네가 잠 자기 전에 엄마가 책 읽어주는 거 좋니? Do you like it when I read to you before bed? Child: Yes, I do. It's fun.

Mom: I'm glad. I like it too.

[page 32]

Mom: What do you see on the last page?

Child: The boy is finally asleep. And the parents are looking in on him in his room.

Mom: Does this make you think of anything from the book?

Child: The first page! At the beginning, the boy is looking into the parents' room, and they're in bed.

Mom: Right.
